Now, let's jet off to their home – the Komodo National Park in Indonesia. Komodo dragons love to live in hot and dry places on these islands, you'll often find them lounging in the sun. They lay eggs which hatch after around eight months, and the little dragons are ready to climb trees to escape predators. They live up to 30 years in the wild, growing and learning to become the apex predators of their habitat.
